CATECHISM:

What is the Third Commandment?

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean? **We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.**

What is the Fourth Commandment? **Honor your father and your mother.**

What does this mean? **We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.**

GOSPEL READING: Luke 7:11-17 ESV

¹¹ Soon afterward he went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a great crowd went with him. ¹² As he drew near to the gate of the town, behold, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow, and a considerable crowd from the town was with her. ¹³ And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her and said to her, “Do not weep.” ¹⁴ Then he came up and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. And he said, “Young man, I say to you, arise.” ¹⁵ And the dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. ¹⁶ Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, saying, “A great prophet has arisen among us!” and “God has visited his people!” ¹⁷ And this report about him spread through the whole of Judea and all the surrounding country.

CATECHESIS:

The wages of sin is death. Loneliness and despair come along with sin because it separates us from our Lord Jesus Christ and those that we love. The widow of Nain's husband already died and now her only son has died as well. She epitomizes the consequences of sin in our lives. However Jesus' miracle is also dramatic. He approached the dead son's body and touched the bier. This is also a sign for us. By touching death, our Lord assumed the guilt of sin, the punishment, the loneliness and the separation that was ours. In His death, Jesus suffered all these things for our redemption. In His death, He has drawn near to us in our death with the ultimate act

of compassion. Through Jesus' death, our death is swallowed up forever and we are reconciled to God and one another in our Lord Jesus Christ.

APOSTLES' CREED:
