CATECHISM:

What is the Ninth Commandment?

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.

What is the Tenth Commandment?

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

GOSPEL READING: John 4:46-54 ESV

⁴⁶ So he came again to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. And at Capernaum there was an official whose son was ill. ⁴⁷ When this man heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸ So Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe." ⁴⁹ The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." ⁵⁰ Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way. ⁵¹ As he was going down, his servants met him and told him that his son was recovering. ⁵² So he asked them the hour when he began to get better, and they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." ⁵³ The father knew that was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." And he himself believed, and all his household. ⁵⁴ This was now the second sign that Jesus did when he had come from Judea to Galilee.

RESPONSE: O Lord, have mercy upon us.

CATECHESIS:

When Jesus heals the Official's son, He teaches us that His Word always gives what it says. Jesus does not lie. His words tell the truth and have the power to do as Jesus

says. Jesus is the Word of God. When the Word of God was spoken at creation, it did what He said. He said, "Let there be light," and there was light and it was good. When Jesus says, "Go; your son will live," the boy is healed that very hour. The Official believed Jesus' Word and it was credited unto him as righteousness. You can always hold Jesus to His Word since Jesus does not deceive you. When Jesus says to you, "I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," "I forgive you all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" and "Take eat, this is My Body; Take drink, this is My Blood," we know it is true, since Jesus has said so. The Holy Spirit works through the Word of God to create faith in Christ. The Christian Faith is simply listening to Jesus and believing what Jesus promises to us in His Word.

APOSTLES' CREED:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
