CATECHISM:

*What does God say about all these commandments?*

**He says: "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments."**

*What does this mean?*

**God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.**

CATECHESIS:

The kingdom of heaven has been coming into the world with violence. Wherever the Gospel of Jesus Christ is preached, sinners are being brought into the Kingdom of God through faith in Jesus Christ and there is violence. The Old Adam is sentenced to death in the waters of Baptism, sinners are bought back from the kingdom of darkness and Satan becomes angered by it all. Wherever the Gospel is preached and wherever repentance is being worked in sinners, Satan will be close at hand to cause trouble and work against the Christian faith by challenging the claims of the Holy Gospel. Christians should expect such trouble from those inside and outside of the Christian Church. As it was in the days of John the Baptist when the multitudes were being brought to faith, so it was in Luther's day and so it will be in our own day.
