CATECHISM:

What is the Second Petition?
Thy Kingdom come.

What does this mean?
The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also.

How does God's kingdom come?
God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 21:25-36 ESV

²⁵ “And there will be signs in sun and moon and stars, and on the earth distress of nations in perplexity because of the roaring of the sea and the waves, ²⁶ people fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world. For the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷ And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. ²⁸ Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near. ²⁹ And he told them a parable: Look at the fig tree, and all the trees. ³⁰ As soon as they come out in leaf, you see for yourselves and know that the summer is already near. ³¹ So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. ³² Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all has taken place. ³³ Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. ³⁴ “But watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day come upon you suddenly like a trap. ³⁵ For it will come upon all who dwell on the face of the whole earth. ³⁶ But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.

CATECHESIS:

The end is coming and this should not be a surprise. Wars, perplexity, violence, disasters, and other great calamities all show that creation is disintegrating and these signs and warnings have all been with us since the fall into sin. Sin has taken its toll and all have inherited its curse. But when you see these great and terrible things happening, take comfort and rejoice for the end is coming. And also rejoice, for your salvation has

already been won by Jesus Christ. On Calvary, our Lord came in a cloud, nailed to the cross, bleeding and dying showing His power over sin and death, and there Jesus revealed His great glory. On the cross, Jesus Christ bought you back out of sin, death and Hell. So fear not, no matter what you may experience. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. Remember, our Lord is faithful and He will see you through to the very end. For Jesus began a good work in your Baptism and He will bring it to completion by returning and taking you home to heaven. But for now, in the midst of war, illness, sorrow, guilt, shame and regret, Jesus still comes to you as He has promised in His Holy Word and Sacrament. He speaks His Words of warning and comfort to you. Jesus comes to feed your body with His Body and Blood to strengthen you for your remaining trials to come. So take heart, no matter what lies ahead, for your redemption is drawing near.
