GOSPEL READING: John 16:23-33 ESV

<sup>23</sup> In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. <sup>24</sup> Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full. <sup>25</sup> “I have said these things to you in figures of speech. The hour is coming when I will no longer speak to you in figures of speech but will tell you plainly about the Father. <sup>26</sup> In that day you will ask in my name, and I do not say to you that I will ask the Father on your behalf; <sup>27</sup> for the Father himself loves you, because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God. <sup>28</sup> I came from the Father and have come into the world, and now I am leaving the world and going to the Father.” <sup>29</sup> His disciples said, “Ah, now you are speaking plainly and not using figurative speech! <sup>30</sup> Now we know that you know all things and do not need anyone to question you; this is why we believe that you came from God.” <sup>31</sup> Jesus answered them, “Do you now believe? <sup>32</sup> Behold, the hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each to his own home, and will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone, for the Father is with me. <sup>33</sup> I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.”

CATECHESIS:

Jesus Christ has taken up your flesh, was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under

Pontious Pilate, was crucified, died, was buried and rose again from the dead. Jesus destroyed the powers of sin, death and Hell. He has defeated the Devil and has opened up heaven to you through the shedding of His precious blood. On the Last Day, when Jesus takes you to be with Himself, you will ask for nothing. But until that day comes, Our Lord invites you to pray to the Father in His Name, that is the Name of Jesus. And our prayers on this side of glory are the prayer of Jesus in Gethsemane, “not my will, but Thy will be done.” And our Lord will continue to take care of your needs of body and soul throughout this life, both in prosperity and in adversity. But during all of your sufferings in this world, hold fast to Jesus Christ and take heart, for Christ has overcome the world through His death on the cross which forgives all of your sins.
