**CATECHISM:**

***What is Confession?***

Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

***What sins should we confess?***

Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord’s Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.

***Which are these?***

Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments: Are you a father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, or worker? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have you stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?

**GOSPEL READING: Luke 15:1-10 ESV**

<sup>1</sup> Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. <sup>2</sup> And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, “This man receives sinners and eats with them.” <sup>3</sup> So he told them this parable: <sup>4</sup> “What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? <sup>5</sup> And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. <sup>6</sup> And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.’ <sup>7</sup> Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. <sup>8</sup> “Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and seek diligently until she finds it? <sup>9</sup> And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.’ <sup>10</sup> Just so, I tell you, there is joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents.”

**RESPONSE:** O Lord, have mercy upon us.

**CATECHESIS:**

“This man receives sinners and eats with them.” This accusation of the Pharisees is

the very heart of the Gospel. Though the Pharisees meant it as an insult, this demonstrates how gracious, loving and merciful our Lord truly is. For our Lord is holy and righteous and He has every right to cast sinners to Hell. Instead Jesus Christ chose to lay down His life for you, to seek you out when you were lost. He died for you to redeem you from your sins that He might gather you around His holy altar and receive you as a sinner and feed you His own Holy Body and Blood for the forgiveness of your sins. Thanks be to God through our Lord Jesus Christ that He does indeed receive sinners and eats with them. For in eating and drinking our Lord's life-giving Body and Blood, you receive salvation itself from Jesus Christ.

**APOSTLES' CREED:**
