GOSPEL READING: Matthew 5:20-26 ESV

²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. ²¹ “You have heard that it was said to those of old, ‘You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.’ ²² But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, ‘You fool!’ will be liable to the hell of fire. ²³ So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, ²⁴ leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. ²⁵ Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. ²⁶ Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.

CATECHESIS:

All of your righteousness is filth because you constantly murder those around you. You cannot keep this simple commandment or any of the commandments. But Jesus Christ is the one who has fulfilled the Law for you in your place. Jesus perfectly loved and served those around Him and He perfectly loves and serves those around you. Jesus is the one who comes to terms with your accuser, Satan, by dying on the cross for your sins. You will not be handed over to the judge, guard or put into prison. Jesus Christ has paid every last penny of your debt by shedding His precious blood for you. Jesus' righteousness is the righteousness that saves and it is given to you for free because He has baptized you into His death and resurrection. Jesus has taken away your sin so you are not liable to the hell of fire. And in exchange for your sin, Jesus gives you His righteousness and thus you are saved. For the righteousness that Jesus gives to you exceeds that of the scribes and the Pharisees so you will enter the kingdom of heaven because of Jesus Christ.
